

School's History & Demographics:

Built in 1974, Eagle Lake Elementary school has 28 classroom teachers, 4 resource teachers, 10 paraprofessionals and 11 other staff. The enrollment data collected in spring 2016 was 540 students. Of this total enrollment, 19.5% African-American, 44.9% white, and 32.5% Hispanic.



Title I Information: 100% of students receive free breakfast and lunch allowing us to qualify for Federal Assistance through TITLE I. Based on our Title I budget, \$ 2,171.93 is required to be spent on Parent Involvement. Parent input is collected as to how these funds will be spent.

These funds are used for: additional personnel, parent involvement supplies, and instructional supplies.

Monitoring Student Progress

Parent Portal: Accessing your child's information and grades is as easy as 1-2-3. 1) Fill out a PIN Request Form for your student(s); 2) Create a Parent Portal Account at <https://parent.mypolkschools-net>; 3. Follow instructions from the website to access your student(s) account.

Assessments: We follow the District's calendar for assessments in Reading, Math, Science, and Writing. In addition to the district's calendar, student progress will be assessed and monitored using district benchmark assessments, and informal teacher assessments.

Parent Communication: Specific student assessment information and scores are available from your child's teacher/and or guidance counselor. Assessment information will be discussed at parent conferences. Please contact your child's teacher and/or counselor to schedule a convenient appointment.

Parent Conferences: Eagle Lake Elementary is required to have a least one annual parent conference per year. We make every attempt to have one face to face conference but in special situations, a phone conversation may be substituted. During the conference the school compact will be discussed along with additional information concerning your child's academic progress. We encourage parents to make a list of questions and concerns they may have in order to support their child's education.
